

Mr. Watts-Fitzgerald has been the prosecutor in many interesting cases that affect South Florida; everything from fraud cases in connection with the Deepwater Horizon explosion and the subsequent pollution in the Gulf of Mexico to prosecuting Princess Cruise Lines for a second violation of probation for environmental crimes to crimes that violate state and federal fishing rules.

This course is intended to provide guidance for those boat occupants such as guests, friends, spouses, etc., who may find themselves "Suddenly in Command" if the boat captain is no longer able to operate the boat for whatever reason! You are now in charge! Learn what to do in an emergency situation on the water!!!

- How to use the VHF to call for help Using MMSI/ DSC/ EPIRB to call for help
- How to determine your location in any body of
- water and give that information to rescuers Flare usage, life jackets, anchoring, emergency

- Flare usage, life jackets, anchoring, emergency gear etc.
 A discussion of pertinent navigational and weather cell phone apps
 Demonstration of recommended safety equipment as well as a question and answer period.

This just in... A victory for Bristol Bay, Alaska

Bonnies' Past President Mona Brewer emailed:

"Not sure if you have been following this. Years and years to get it done. Almost every conservation group involved. Lots of people on the ground in Washington, D.C. Hundreds of thousands of letters. Paid lobbyists. A great success. I have fished there. It is an American treasure." (photo by Ryan Peterson)

The treasure is Bristol Bay, the easternmost arm of the Bering Sea, located in Southwest Alaska. Its watershed supports the largest sockeye salmon fishery in the world. The victory is that the final determination from the Environmental Protection Agency(EPA) announced last week effectively blocks the mine

planned by Pebble Limited Partnership as well as future mining in the headwaters of Bristol Bay.
